## RedMane Technology's First United Way Campaign: A Resounding Success!

RedMane Technology provides software solutions and systems integration services that address complex, real-world challenges. Our human services expertise includes child welfare, child support, benefit eligibility, and enterprise case management across the U.S. and Canada. We are a problem-solving company. Technology is just one of our tools.

Beginning in 2013, RedMane served as a subcontractor for the development contract for the Missouri Eligibility Determination and Enrollment System (MEDES). As a key, trusted partner to the State of Missouri from the very beginning of the MEDES project, RedMane was responsible for the initial work required for Missouri to become ACA (Affordable Care Act) compliant.

Through our performance and contributions to MEDES success between 2013 and 2018, RedMane earned the confidence and respect of the State MEDES leadership, and in October of 2018 RedMane was awarded the prime contract to be the MEDES Maintenance and Operations (M&O) provider, a responsibility we continue to uphold today.

In February 2019, we opened our Jefferson City office, initially focused solely on the MEDES project. Since then, the team has grown to 40 people and expanded its work across several additional projects:

- 2021 – RedMane Managed Services inception. Managed Services oversees all RedMane project infrastructure. They work with project teams to help design, build, deploy, and maintain robust software applications from the ground up. It's their job to ensure security, compliance, optimization and tuning, and overall application delivery support for the systems we build.
- 2023 – mCase development and support. mCase is a modern human services platform, created by RedMane, that is purpose-

built for human services. It supports the most complex human services programs, from intake, investigation, and ongoing case management to eligibility determination, benefit processing, and provider management. Since last year, our Jefferson City office has had team members actively working to implement a completely new and innovative Provider Licensing & Accreditation solution for South Dakota's Department of Social Services.

While the State of Missouri remains the primary client of RedMane's Jefferson City office, the company also supports software systems in Alaska, Puerto Rico, the U.S. Virgin Islands, South Dakota, Virginia, and Florida.

### 2024 United Way Campaign

Before this year's campaign, our office's community involvement team was searching for new ways we could give back to our community. After learning more about United Way, both through our research and by meeting with their President, Lee, we haven't looked back. United Way is truly an amazing organization that maximizes the impact of donated dollars to help those in our community who are in need. We were personally blown away by United Way's footprint in Central Missouri and all the organizations it serves.

As we embarked on our inaugural United Way employee campaign, we knew it was crucial to set the stage for future years. Our goal was to establish a strong foundation and inspire our team to make a significant impact. Fortunately, we have a diverse group of passionate individuals, many of whom have firsthand experience with United Way's mission. With their guidance and enthusiasm, we were confident that our first campaign would be a resounding success.

To engage our team, we:

- displayed United Way posters and brochures around the office;
- took advantage of the United Way's offer to create a dedicated RedMane donation website and printed donation forms featuring QR codes linking to the donation page;
- hosted a lunch meeting where United Way President

Lee Knernschild and United Way Campaign Co-Chair Doug Hagenhoff shared insights into United Way's mission and the agencies it supports, while Stephanie Johnson touched everyone with her personal experiences at the Special Learning Center – one of the United Way partner agencies. Other team members also shared powerful testimonials about their own donations, volunteer work, and the ways in which friends and family have benefited from United Way programs; and

- offered multiple donation options, including one-time gifts and recurring payroll deductions.

The campaign was a tremendous success, with over 80% participation and more than \$8,000 raised. At RedMane, giving back isn't just something we do—it's who we are. Through our partnership with United Way, we are committed to supporting initiatives that provide essential services, promote education, and enhance financial stability for individuals and families in need. By contributing our time, resources, and efforts, we help build a stronger and more resilient community for all.

- 282 homebound residents received balanced meals delivered to their doorstep in coordination with the Senior Nutrition Center.
- Special Learning Center's Super Kids Infinite Possibilities Clinic provided life-changing therapy assisting children with their first steps and more.
- Dreams to Reality provided transformative services to 230 women in preparation for career and employment opportunities.
- Children of low and middle-income working families found affordable, quality childcare through Little Explorers Discovery

Center and the YMCA Child Development Center.

- And over 20,000 meals were provided through The Salvation Army's Community Meal program assisting those facing food insecurity.

# Making the Season Bright for Foster & Adoptive Families

## CMFCAA's purpose to preserve families and bring holiday cheer

This holiday season, Central Missouri Foster Care & Adoption Association (CMFCAA) is embracing the spirit of giving by working to provide Christmas gifts to more than 700 foster, adoptive, and kinship children across Central Missouri.

While the holidays are often seen as a magical time of year, they can also be especially challenging for foster and adoptive children. The Christmas Care Pack program, personalized to meet each family's unique needs, aims to remind these children that they are seen, valued, and deeply loved during a season that can bring mixed emotions. This initiative was made possible in large part through the United Way's funding, which has helped us expand our efforts to reach every child in need.

The care packs are one way CMFCAA provides essential services and unwavering support to kinship, foster, and adoptive families in our community. Through innovative programs, heartfelt initiatives, and an incredible network of partners, including the United Way of Central Missouri,

CMFCAA strives to break the cycle of abuse and neglect and create stronger, more resilient families.

## Preserving families with the Placement Preservation Program

Another standout initiative at CMFCAA is the Placement Preservation Program, led by Chief Clinical Officer Dave Bruno. This program launched earlier this year to provide critical intervention services to families at risk of disruption. By offering counseling, resources, and hands-on support, the program has already helped families stay together and thrive under difficult circumstances. The program currently has 10 cases and is adding a third specialist to keep up with the workload.

"Our Placement Preservation Program embodies what CMFCAA is all about — keeping families whole," says Jill Quaid, CEO of CMFCAA. "Thanks to the support of the United Way and our community partners, we've been able to launch this program and make a real difference in the lives of families facing challenging situations."

## A season of impact

This year, CMFCAA saw incredible support during its Legacy of Love Gala, where the community came together to raise more than \$117,000. These funds, combined with United Way's partnership, have allowed CMFCAA to expand programs, distribute thousands of essential items, and ensure families feel supported year-round.

With Christmas around the corner, the CMFCAA team is hard at work sorting and preparing the Christmas Care Packs.

From toys and winter clothing to gift cards and household essentials, these packs are a lifeline for families who might otherwise struggle during the holidays.

"It's about reminding families that they are not alone, and there's a community that cares deeply for them," Quaid said.

As a proud United Way partner agency, CMFCAA has been able to amplify its impact through collaboration with other United Way-supported organizations. Together, these agencies form a safety net of resources and support, ensuring that families and children have access to the services they need.

# Building Homes, Building Futures: How River City Habitat for Humanity is Strengthening Our Community

At River City Habitat for Humanity, we believe that everyone deserves a safe, affordable place to call home. For over 30 years, we've been working to make that vision a reality in Jefferson City, partnering with families and volunteers to not only build 134 homes but to also build a community filled with hope. But we don't do this work alone. We rely on the generosity of community members and organizations like the United Way to make it happen.

This year, we were honored to receive a Community Support Grant from the United Way, which has made a tangible difference in how we serve our community. With the grant funds, we purchased a dump trailer for our construction sites, a practical yet transformative addition to our operations.

Before we had the dump trailer, managing construction waste was a costly and time-consuming process. For every job site, we rented dumpsters to dispose of materials like drywall scraps and other debris. Not only did this add to our expenses, but it also required meticulous scheduling to ensure timely deliveries and pickups to get

the most out of each expensive rental.

The new dump trailer has streamlined our workflow, allowing us to haul waste efficiently without relying on external rentals. This shift has already saved us dollars—money that can now be redirected toward building more homes and helping more families. It's also saving time for our construction teams, giving them more hours in the day to focus on what they do best: building safe, sturdy homes. For our homeowners, this efficiency means we can keep their housing costs as affordable as possible. Because it's not just about constructing houses; it's about creating opportunities for families to thrive.

The success of this initiative is a testament to the power of partnerships. United Way's support helps organizations like ours tackle challenges creatively and sustainably. Together, we're proving that when we pool our resources and align our efforts, we can create lasting change.

At River City Habitat for Humanity, we're always seeking innovative ways to build more homes and serve more families. The dump trailer is just one example of how community support enables us to adapt and improve. As we move forward, we're committed to continuing this work with the same passion and purpose that has guided us for years. We invite you to join us on this journey. To conclude the event United Way President Lee Knernschild said, "Our hope is that everyone leaves here today inspired and with the realization that working together we can accomplish




were served by the United Way of Central Missouri partner agencies.


